

HIDDEN LITURGY:

TRACES OF RITES AND CELEBRATIONS IN THE PARATEXTS OF GREEK GOSPEL

MANUSCRIPTS

The Greek Gospel manuscripts contain numerous paratexts that provide evidence of their liturgical use, such as calendars, liturgical notes and prayers. However, some other references to liturgical rites and practices are somehow hidden. These appear in exegetical paratexts dealing with difficult biblical passages or details not included in the biblical account, but which respond to questions asked by readers or listeners of the Bible. The seminar introduces these paratexts and provides insights into the methodological challenges of classifying and interpreting these texts, some of which have never been published before.
