

FROM THE WORKBENCH OF THE VIENNA EUCHOLOGIA PROJECT: LIMITATIONS, CHALLENGES AND A CASE STUDY

This seminar will offer a view from the workbench of the Vienna Euchologia Project. What began as an investigation of the occasional prayers preserved in euchologia as new sources for social history and the history of daily life in the Byzantine Empire, has now evolved into a more complex investigation into the nature of transmission and the authorship of prayer texts. A prayer for the growth of silkworms will serve as a case study to show how euchologia material can be investigated in larger historical contexts.
